EU SANCTIONS PACKAGE HIT RUSSIAN LNG, SHADOW FLEET TANKERS

June 20 - The European Union has approved a new package of sanctions over Russia's invasion of Ukraine, seeking to tighten the enforcement of restrictions by widening the scope of measures to its network of accomplices and hit Moscow's revenues.

The measures target Russia's shadow fleet of tankers, and transshipments of liquefied natural gas to third countries. While this is the EU's first move to restrict Russian LNG operations, the bloc will still allow deliveries of the fuel from Moscow to the region. gCaptain / Read more

ONE INCIDENT ONE RESPONSE APPROACH GETS SPOTLIGHT AT EU CIVIL PROTECTION FORUM



Last week, the Sea Alarm team was invited by the European Commission to present the One Incident One Response approach at the EU's Civil Protection Forum and to give a demo of the OneX serious games package. The sessions

were jointly organised with the Swedish Civil Contingencies Agency and the Finnish Border Guard, and we also met participants on a booth in the Civil Protection Village over the 2 day event.

The One Incident One Response approach was first developed with EU funding with the aim to bring coastal and maritime

authorities together to prepare for new and emerging risk profiles that impact both maritime and coastal domains. The approach detects critical gaps in existing preparedness systems by focusing on ranges of scenario-related challenges. Sea Alarm / Read more

EUROPE: AUSTRIA'S LAST-MINUTE SUPPORT ENABLES EU NATURE RESTORATION LAW

After months of deadlock, the EU's Nature Restoration Law passed, driven by a crucial change of heart from Austria.

Environment ministers in Luxembourg voted to pass the Nature Restoration Law, aiming to restore 20% of land and sea by 2030. Austria's last-minute decision to support the law was pivotal in breaking the deadlock among EU countries. The law targets long-term ecosystem restoration but faced criticism for potential economic and administrative burdens on the agricultural sector. EHN / Read more

EUROPE: WHERE NATURE RESTORATION MEETS INFRASTRUCTURE DEVELOPMENT: COUNCIL APPROVES NEW REGULATION

Despite EU and international efforts, biodiversity loss and the degradation of ecosystems continue at an alarming rate, harming people, the economy and the climate. These were the remarks of the European Commission nearly two years ago as it published a proposal for a Regulation on nature restoration.

The proposal set out binding rules and targets to restore ecosystems with the goals of both ensuring recovery to biodiverse and resilient nature, and of contributing to climate change mitigation and adaptation. Now that Member States have, in the European Council, adopted the consolidated text of the proposal, it will be published in the OJEU and enter into force 20 days later. It will be directly applicable in Ireland. Mondaq / Read more

The European Parliament adopted a new Environmental Crime Directive on April 11, 2024, effective May 20, 2024, criminalizing severe environmental damage akin to ecocide. The directive includes updated criminal offenses, severe penalties, and mandatory training for law enforcement, positioning the EU as the first international body to criminalize ecocide. CANADA: EMERGENCY ORDER TO PROTECT BOREAL CARIBOU HABITAT IN QUEBEC

While the provinces and territories have primary responsibility for managing land and wildlife within their jurisdictions, the Species at Risk Act includes provisions designed to protect species at risk and their habitats on non-federal lands. This is particularly the case of section 80, which stipulates that the Minister of Environment and Climate Change has an obligation to recommend to the Governor in Council that an emergency order be made if the Minister is of the opinion that a species faces imminent threats to its survival or recovery. NIGERIA: FG TO BEGIN ASSESSMENT OF OGONI CLEAN-UP

June 16 - The Federal Government has announced plans to begin an assessment of the ongoing clean-up of oil-polluted sites in Ogoni land in Rivers State to ascertain how it impacts the lives and livelihood of the people. The government promised that it would give proper attention to addressing the challenges and bottlenecks affecting the development of the oil and gas-rich area.

Two sets of New Naval fence booms from EMSA's Equipment Assistance Service stockpile in Varna have been delivered to Odessa, Ukraine. The equipment, which totals 800 metres in length, has been donated to the Ukrainian Sea Ports Authority to assist in tackling potential pollution from sunk and damaged vessels in Kherson Port. All ports in Ukraine currently require equipment to combat marine pollution. The equipment is being donated to Ukraine by EMSA in the framework of the Black and Caspian Sea (BCSEA) II project. OR&R Highlights Plastic Debris Research in the Great Lakes Basin at International Research Conference

The International Association for Great Lakes Research (link is external) (IAGLR) held its 67th annual Conference on Great Lakes Research from May 20-24, 2024, in Windsor, Ontario. More than 700 freshwater researchers and practitioners from across the Laurentian Great Lakes region and African Great Lakes met. More than 600 presentations took place throughout the week's nearly 50 sessions, all while exploring the theme of "Shared Lakes: One Water, One Health."

New CAMEO Chemicals Product Update Offers Enhanced Emergency Response Data and Improved Usability

The latest version of the CAMEO Chemicals 3.1.0 hazardous materials database is now available. The latest release includes key emergency response data updates from the 2024 Emergency Response Guidebook (ERG) that are the result of a four-year, multinational collaboration.

OR&R Aerial Remote Sensing Research for Oil Detection Soars at the Coastal Response Research Center

During the first week of June, members from the U.S. Coast Guard (USCG), Coastal Response Research Center (CRRC), New Hampshire Department of Environmental Services, and OR&R joined forces to test remote sensing capabilities for detecting oil slicks on water using uncrewed aerial systems (UAS), commonly referred to as "drones."

OR&R Holds Annual Incident Management Training

On May 30, OR&R's Disaster Preparedness Program held their annual National Ocean Service (NOS) <u>Incident Management Team</u> (IMT) 101 training. The training provided newer and long-term IMT members with an overview of their roles and responsibilities, as well as information on response management systems, tools, and best practices in managing all-hazard disasters. As a result of the training, IMT members gained a better understanding of NOS's priorities during a response.

Abandoned and Derelict Vessel Removal Grant Program Request for Applications

On June 10, the <u>BoatUS Foundation</u>(link is external), in partnership with the NOAA Marine Debris Program, announced a call for applications under the Abandoned and Derelict Vessel Removal Grant Program. With funding from the NOAA Marine Debris Program provided by the Bipartisan Infrastructure Law, the BoatUS Foundation will award up to \$7.5 million in grants to remove abandoned and derelict vessels (ADVs) across coastal and marine areas of the United States.

OR&R Facilitates Marine Protected Areas Capacity Building Program

This month, the NOAA Marine Debris Program's Chief Scientist, Amy V. Uhrin, recently traveled to Baler, Aurora Province, Philippines to support both the NOAA Office of National Marine Sanctuaries' (ONMS) International Marine Protected Areas Capacity Building Team (IMPACT) and the Philippines Department of Environment and Natural Resources' (DENR) National Integrated Protected Areas System (NIPAS), Marine Protected Areas Capacity Building Program as a co-facilitator for their training workshop on Assessing Benefits and Threats in Marine Ecosystems, with a focus on seagrass.

VANAUTU: HOW THE SMALL PACIFIC ISLAND NATION OF VANUATU DRASTICALLY CUT PLASTIC POLLUTION

June 20 - For generations, the people of Erakor village in the Pacific nation of Vanuatu would pass their time swimming in the local lagoon. Ken Andrew, a local chief, remembers diving in its depths when he was a child, chasing the fish that spawned in its turquoise waters. That was decades ago. Now 52, Andrew has noticed a more pernicious entity invading the lagoon: plastic.

"The plastic would form a small island inside the lagoon, it was so thick," Andrew says. "We used fishing nets to pull some of the trash out, but we didn't know how to get rid of it all. We couldn't conquer it, there was just too much." While residents were struggling to empty Vanuatu's waters of plastic, the country's politicians were considering another solution. Could they stop the waste directly at the source? The Guardian / Read more



YEMEN: SHIP EVACUATED AND ABLAZE AFTER ATTACK BY YEMEN'S HOUTHIS

June 15 - The United Kingdom Maritime Trade Operations (UKMTO) said on Saturday the crew of a Palau-flagged cargo ship had been evacuated and the ship was on fire and sinking, referring to an incident that happened 98 nautical miles east of Yemen's Aden on June 13. URUGUAY: PIPELINE SPILL – REPORT FROM CARLOS SAGRERA, ISCO REPRESENTATIVE IN LATIN AMERICA





June 19 - Oil leak in ANCAP Pipeline – Costa Azul, Uruguay - Although neither the amount of crude oil spilled nor the origin of the leak has been officially confirmed, ANCAP (the state company that refines crude oil for consumption in Uruguay) reported that on Tuesday17 June a crude oil leak occurred in its pipeline that connects the José Ignacio Oil Buoy with its Refinery in La Teja in the city of Montevideo (https://www.ancap.com.uy/2158/1/operacion-terminales.html). The incident was detected at km 56 of the Ruta Interbalnearia (Costa Azul – Dept. Canelones) which connects the capital Montevideo with the main seaside resorts on the Uruguayan Atlantic coast, including José gnacio, the site of the oil buoy (SPM) where all the crude oil destined for refining in Uruguay is unloaded. ANCAP reported that the exact location of the leak had been detected and progress was being made in repairing and welding the pipeline (photos attached).

Despite the fact that the Uruguayan Environmental Authority (DINAMA), reported that a strong smell of oil was found at the site, indicated that there were no signs of contamination, the oil company said in a subsequent statement that there had been a spill and that its personnel and an OSRO were working on the recovery of the spilled product. Also it was indicated that the thickness of the pipeline is within the manufacturer's range and that the leak was in a crack of a few mm, it should be remembered that the main Uruguayan pipeline has been installed for more than 40 years and requires increasingly exhaustive maintenance (https://www.api.org/oil-and-natural-gas/wells-to-consumer/transporting-oil-natural-gas/pipeline/pipeline-recommended-practices), and it is likely that the frequency of these incidents will increase, requiring replacement decisions, probably in the short term. Absorbent material used for recovery and the initial flow of oil through apluvial gutter could be observed. The company subsequently reported that the site was being cleaned up and remediated. The state company OSE, in charge of drinking water treatment, reported that no pollution was found in the Sarandí stream, located 1,200 metres from the site of the incident.
