MEDITERRANEAN SEA TEN YEARS OF OIL POLLUTION DETECTION IN THE EASTERN MEDITERRANEAN SHIPPING LANES OPPOSITE THE EGYPTIAN COAST USING REMOTE SENSING TECHNIQUES

The Eastern Mediterranean region, a vital conduit for global maritime trade, faces significant environmental challenges due to marine pollution, particularly from oil spills. This is the first study covering the long period of comprehensive monitoring of oil pollution using the full mission of Sentinel-1 Synthetic Aperture Radar (SAR) data in the Mediterranean Sea, so this research aims to detect and analyze comprehensively the occurrence of oil spills in the Eastern Mediterranean over a decade (2014–2023). This study focuses on identifying geographical distribution patterns, proximity to shorelines, frequency across maritime zones, and potential sources of these spills, especially around major ports and maritime routes. In terms of shipwrecks, there are over 3000 ships sank in the Pacific, with most of them in the economic zones of the Federated States of Micronesia, Palau, Papua New Guinea, the Republic of the Marshall Islands and Solomon Islands. 

BRAZIL: ENGAGEMENT WITH THE FISHING COMMUNITY IN OIL SPILL RESPONSE

Spill Response in Brazil - Vessels of Opportunity (VoO) Management – Mar Atento Project

EnvironPact (https://www.environpact.com/en/), a member of the OceanPac Group (https://oceanpact.com/en/home/) and a corporate member of ISCO, with the support of Shell Brazil and Equinor Brazil has developed an outstanding project to engage and train the fishing community, in the area of the states of Rio de Janeiro and Espiritu Santo, with its Vessels of Opportunity (VoO) to support spill response and control operations off the coast of Brazil. In this

context, Adriano Ranieri, Pedro de Moraes Rego Martins and other co-authors of these companies have produced an interesting article, the summary of which is given here:

"The Mar Atento Project was designed and implemented with the objective of engaging and training the Brazilian artisanal fishing community to respond to an oil spill affecting the Brazilian coastalwaters. After 5 years, up to 500 people were engaged, 294 fishing community members were trained, and 93 Vessels of Opportunity (VoO) were registered in a Geodata bank improving the overall preparedness and decision-making process in the event of an oil spill. The project is based on four major milestones: (i) Survey of secondary and primary data for project planning and detailed design, including but not limited to local fishing community, local logistics and supply chain; (ii) Implementation of several engagement efforts, principally the Expo Mar Atento Exhibition. (iii) Preparation and execution of a customized theoretical and practical training focused on the operational concepts of an oil spill response in a shoreline environment; and (iv) Lessons Learned Event, where the fishing community watch a video highlighting the activities they participated in during the earlier phases of the project. Additionally, they receive a photo book and have the opportunity to share their impressions about the project." CANADA: FEDERAL GOVERNMENT ANNOUNCES SUPPORT FOR COMMUNITY-LED HEALTH STUDY IN ATHABASCA OIL SANDS REGION

August 7 - The Minister of Environment and Climate Change, the Honourable Steven Guilbeault, visited Fort Chipewyan, Alberta and met with community leaders and members to better understand their concerns about the environmental and human health risks associated with living near the Athabasca oil sands region. These concerns were heightened in February 2023, when the federal government and Indigenous communities were made aware of an incident impacting the area from the oil sands industry.

Today, Minister Guilbeault announced that the Government of Canada is going to make available nearly \$12 million over 10 years for the Fort Chipewyan Health Study. The community-led health study, with the Athabasca Chipewyan First Nation, the Mikisew Cree First Nation and the Fort Chipewyan Métis Nation, will examine the impacts of the oil sands on community members' health. The design of the community-led health study, currently underway, will outline the communities' objectives and study methodology. They may include an assessment of whether there are heightened risks for cancer and other health and environmental impacts for downstream communities related to activity in the oil sands region. CANADA INVESTS OVER \$12.5 MILLION TO INCREASE CONSERVED AREAS PRIMARILY IN SOUTHERN ONTARIO

August 7 - Today, Julie Dabrusin, Member of Parliament for Toronto—Danforth, and Parliamentary Secretary to the Minister of Environment and Climate Change Canada and to the Minister of Energy and Natural Resources Canada along with Tony Van Bynen, Member of Parliament for Newmarket—Aurora, on behalf of the Honourable Steven Guilbeault, Minister of Environment and Climate Change, announced that the Government of Canada has invested over \$12.5 million in Canada Nature Fund and Enhanced Nature Legacy funding (through the Target 1 Challenge program) with Conservation Ontario to support the acquisition of land primarily in southern Ontario.

This funding has resulted in the conservation of over 1,600 hectares of land, a crucial step toward increasing habitat for species at risk; helping to tackle climate change; and supporting conservation, restoration, and protection of our natural environment. These conserved areas are vital for enhancing biodiversity, safeguarding floodplains, and expanding Canada's conservation network. Canada.ca / Read more

IRELAND ELECTED TO THE COUNCIL OF THE INTERNATIONAL SEABED AUTHORITY

August 3 - Tánaiste, Minister for Foreign Affairs and Minister for Defence, Micheál Martin TD has welcomed Ireland's inaugural election to the Council of the International Seabed Authority (ISA). Welcoming the ISA Assembly's decision to elect Ireland to the Council for the year 2025, the Tánaiste said: "Ireland will take its seat on the ISA Council at a time when our oceans are already facing significant challenges, including habitat destruction, pollution, unsustainable fishing practices, sea-level rise, ocean acidification and ocean warming. August 8 - The Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) today published its Annual Report and Accounts 2023. It coincides with the thirtieth anniversary of the EPA's establishment and outlines EPA activity in 2023. The Annual Report and Accounts for 2023 provides an overview of EPA's role as a regulator, EPA's monitoring and assessment of the environment, and insights and analysis on climate action and sustainable production and consumption. ITALY: COMPLETE MAPPING OF THE ITALIAN COAST AND COASTAL HABITATS LAUNCH OF THE WEBGIS PLATFORM

August 9 - The PNRR MER project is an ambitious initiative that aims to map the entire Italian coast in detail, both the emerged and submerged parts. The project's coverage area extends up to 800 meters landward and up to 50 meters depth at sea, including the boundaries of marine protected areas and Natura 2000 sites. A crucial element of the project is the development of a WebGIS – Cloud platform, currently in beta version, which allows access to the collected data and real-time monitoring of mapping activities.

LIBERIA: MARGIBI VILLAGERS ACCUSE CHINESE LEE GROUP OF ENTERPRISES OF POLLUTING NYARFOR RIVER WITH CHEMICAL WASTE AND HUMAN FECES

August 7 -The villagers say the company's rubber processing plant is discharging chemical waste and human feces from its septic tank into the river. The affected villages along the Nyarfor River include Yarkpasue, Johnny Bah Village, David Town, and Cooper Farm. UK: GOVERNMENT LAUNCHES RAPID REVIEW TO MEET ENVIRONMENT ACT TARGETS

August 1 - The Government has today (30 July) announced a rapid review of the Environmental Improvement Plan (EIP) to be completed by the end of the year to deliver our legally binding targets to save nature. The Government will develop a new, statutory plan to protect and restore our natural environment with delivery plans to meet each of our ambitious Environment Act targets. This will focus on cleaning up our waterways, reducing waste across the economy, planting millions more trees, improving air quality and halting the decline in species by 2030. The review will engage with stakeholders across environment and nature, farming, resources, waste and water sectors, working hand in glove with businesses, local authorities and civil society across the country to develop new ambitious plans to save nature. UK: ALMOST 500 CHEMICALS FOUND IN ENGLAND'S RIVERS AND GROUNDWATER

August 6 - Almost 500 different chemicals, some of which are banned, have been found in various mixtures across all 171 river and groundwater catchments tested in England in 2024, according to data from the Environment Agency, analysed by the Guardian and Watershed Investigations. More than half of them are classified as very toxic, toxic or harmful to aquatic life, according to the European Chemicals Agency (ECHA), and a banned, carcinogenic "forever chemical" was among 20 "substances of very high concern" found.

"What this shows is that the way we monitor and manage chemicals in our rivers is completely unfit for purpose," said Alistair Boxall, professor in environmental science at the University of York. The Guardian / Read more

UK: UKOPA'S PERO COURSE CELEBRATES 15 YEARS OF SUCCESS

August 9 - For more than 15 years UKOPA has been offering its members the opportunity to take part in the widely acclaimed PERO (Pipeline Emergency Response Officer) course. The course is designed by pipeline operators for pipeline operators, helping ensure there is consistency across industry in how operators respond to pipeline emergency incidents in the UK.

The latest PERO course replaced an initial course developed following the introduction of the Pipelines Safety Regulations Act in 1996. The course helps fulfil the requirement for pipeline operators to have established policies, procedures and personnel in place to respond and manage potential incidents to pipelines transporting oil or gas. Under Donal Cullen's chairmanship of the UKOPA Emergency Planning Work Group in the mid 2000's, the group tasked themselves to build and develop a better and more fit for purpose course. The course took a couple of years to create and be approved by the UKOPA members before being rolled out in the Spring of 2009. The course is targeted towards anyone designated as having a front line role in responding to a pipeline incident and is a means of showing a company has suitably trained and competent person(s) to attend and manage a pipeline incident if needed. NOAA Announces Four New Projects to Support Disaster Preparedness in Coastal Communities

For the third year in a row, NOAA's Office Response and Restoration (OR&R) and National Sea Grant College Program (Sea Grant) are partnering to support coastal communities to prepare for, respond to and recover from natural or human-caused disasters. A total of \$791,395 in fiscal year 2024 federal funds is anticipated to support

four projects over two years in Alaska, Connecticut, the Northern Gulf of Mexico region and South Carolina, focused on strengthening local disaster readiness and recovery in underserved communities.

OR&R Announces New Chief of Emergency Response Division



NOAA's Office of Response and Restoration (OR&R) is excited to announce that John Tarpley was recently selected as Chief of OR&R's Emergency Response Division (ERD)—the program within OR&R that provides scientific support for preparedness and response to spills and other coastal emergencies.

John's vision, subject matter expertise, leadership, and emergency management experience is an excellent fit in this pivotal role within OR&R. John took the helm of the division on August 1, 2024.

Settlement Finalized to Resolve Natural Resource Damages Claim in Seattle's Lower Duwamish River

On July 15, 2024, the United States District Court for the Western District of Washington <u>finalized a settlement</u> with General Recycling and two affiliates valued at over \$23 million for adverse impacts to natural resources resulting from hazardous substance releases into the <u>Lower Duwamish River in Washington</u>.

OR&R Flies With Coast Guard in Hurricane Response Training

On June 18, staff with NOAA's Office of Response and Restoration (OR&R) flew with a team from the U.S. Coast Guard's Aviation Training Center (ATC) Mobile in Mobile, Alabama, as part of a broad hurricane response exercise to observe the capabilities of Coast Guard aircraft for potential use in pollution and environmental disaster response.

WORLD-LEADING TRAINING COURSE PROVIDERS

USA: LOUISIANA - CONTINUED EFFORTS TO CLEAN UP CRUDE OIL SPILLED INTO BAYOU LAFOURCHE

August 2 - Clean-up efforts are continuing days after oil was spilled into Bayou Lafourche in Raceland on July 27. So far, 1300 barrels of oil-contaminated water have been removed. Wgno.com / Read more

August 5 - The cleanup was finally starting to move along. It had been nearly a week since an enormous fire broke out at a chemical company in northwest Toronto. SOUTH AFRICA: BAD WEATHER HAMPERS CLEAN-UP AND SALVAGE EFFORTS ON SOUTH AFRICAN BEACH

August 6 - Officials provided an update on the clean-up and salvage efforts for the cargo ship Ultra Galaxy (13,800 dwt) that grounded and later broke up on a remote part of the South African coast north of Cape Town. Teams are continuing to struggle with difficult weather conditions which broke the vessel and are hampering efforts to retrieve the oil that remains onboard. The Maritime Executive / Read more

August 8 - Investigation Underway into Ultra Galaxy Casualty off South Africa - While bad weather continues to hamper the salvage efforts of the broken bulker Ultra Galaxy, officials from the South African Maritime Safety Authority (SAMSA) report the investigation process into the cause of casualty is underway. Under maritime law, Panama as the flag state of the vessel is leading the investigation while South Africa because it was affected by the wreck is assisting in the efforts. SAMSA reports that a team consisting of a surveyor and a technical expert from Panama is arriving in the country and will be meeting with SAMSA. This comes after the investigators from Panama flew to the Philippines for interviews with the crew of the Ultra Galaxy which have already been repatriated after they were rescued from the ship a month ago. PHILIPPINES: US COAST GUARD MEN IN LIMAY TO HELP CURB MT TERRANOVA OIL SPILL

August 6 - MEMBERS of the United States Coast Guard and a Washington-based oceanic team arrived in Bataan province in northern Philippines on Tuesday to help the Philippines contain an oil spill from a sunken vessel. The eight-man US team would give technical assistance to a local team deployed to recover three vessels that sank off the coast of Bataan last month, the Philippine Coast Guard (PCG) said in a statement. August 7 - Oceana Gives Update on Risk of Devastating Oil Spill in Manila Bay - An Oceana analysis of satellite imagery from the Philippine Space Agency shows the Manila Bay oil spill – resulting from a submerged oil tanker and at least two other vessels – covered 84 square kilometers on July 28, and 27 square kilometers as of July 30. Karagatan Patrol, an online platform established by Oceana, estimates this impacts 50% of Manila Bay, with the oil pollution reaching Cavite, Bulacan, and Bataan. Oceana / Read more

Augut 8 - Pampanga gov't dispatches booms vs oil spill from sunken tanker - The Pampanga government, together with the national government agencies and volunteers, have deployed oil spill booms off the waters of Pampanga to protect its fishing industry. Pampanga Governor Dennis Pineda said the Provincial Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Council, Provincial Government Environment and Natural Resources Office, Philippine Coast Guard, Department of Environment and Natural Resources, and volunteers cooperated to make the oil spill booms from coconut waste products and plastic bottles. INDONESIA: EXPLOSION AND FIRE ON TANKER IN INDONESIA KILLS 5, INJURES 15 CREW

August 7 - Indonesian authorities are investigating after receiving a report of explosions and a fire aboard an interisland tanker overnight off the island of Tepekong near the eastern tip of Bali on the Java Sea. The final count appears to be five crewmembers killed, three severely burned, and 12 others with lesser injuries. There was a total of 21 crewmembers aboard. The Maritime Executive / Read more

USA: MAINE - COAST GUARD LEADS REMOVAL OF ABANDONED FISHING BOAT

August 7 - The U.S. Coast Guard is leading an operation to raise and remove a sunken fishing vessel from the harbor in Harpswell, Maine, in order to fix an ongoing source of pollution. The 1949-built sardine boat Jacob Pike went down in January after a series of winter storms battered the Maine coast. The wreck has been leaking fuel into the marine environment, and the Coast Guard estimates that it could contain up to 1,000 gallons of diesel. USCG News / Read more

USA: ALASKA - COAST GUARD, ALASKA DEPARTMENT OF ENVIRONMENTAL CONSERVATION RESPONDING TO FLOODING IN MENDENHALL VALLEY

August 8 - The Coast Guard and Alaska Department of Environmental Conservation are responding to flooding in Mendenhall Valley,

Wednesday. "We are working hand-in-hand with our ADEC partners in response to flooding in the Mendenhall Lake and River areas," said Cmdr. Stacey Tate, the Chief of Response at Sector Southeast Alaska. "We have air, land and water-based teams assessing damage and taking action to mitigate any potential pollution threats in the region."

Capt. Stanley Fields, the Coast Guard Captain of the Port and Federal On-Scene Coordinator; Rachael Krajewski, ADEC State On-Scene Coordinator; and Denise Koch, Incident Commander and Director of Engineering and Public Works conducted an overflight of Mendenhall Valley, Tuesday, aboard an Air Station Sitka MH-60 Jayhawk helicopter to assess impacted areas and potential areas of pollution concern. Pollution responders are also conducting shoreline assessments along Mendenhall River and water-side assessments in and around Fritz Cove via a response boat from Station Juneau. FRANCE: MALICIOUS POLLUTION: HYDROCARBONS SPILLED INTO A BASIN AT THE ARDA SITE IN ÉTANG-SALÉ

August 8 - The Region warns of malicious behaviour in the municipality of Étang-Salé. The ARDA site was deliberately polluted. A large quantity of hydrocarbons assimilated to used waste oil was spilled into a basin, creating serious and harmful pollution for fauna and flora. As a matter of urgency, the municipality has put in place measures to limit the spread of pollution and the Regional Council has undertaken studies to carry out isolation work and prevent pollutant transfers. In consultation with the DEAL and the French Office for Biodiversity (OFB), and in collaboration with the CIVIS, the municipality of Étang-Salé and the Regional Council, the decontamination of the site will be initiated as soon as possible to restore its original biodiversity.
