NORTH-EAST ATLANTIC

Coordinated international action aims to halt decline of marine birds in the North-East Atlantic

OSPAR's Quality Status Report 2023 showed that marine birds continue to be in trouble due to the effects of climate change and other pressures resulting from human activities such as mortality, habitat loss and degradation. In direct response to this assessment countries from around the North-East Atlantic together with the European Union have adopted an action plan to reduce and eliminate the main pressures that arise from certain human activities that impact marine birds in the North-East Atlantic. The Regional Action Plan for Marine Birds (RAP-Bird) was developed in consultation with stakeholders from the renewables, fisheries and conservation sectors, and identifies a series of important protection and conservation actions that support the achievement of OSPAR's North-East Atlantic Environment Strategy 2030 to achieve biologically diverse and healthy seas, and which will help to halt the decline of marine birds. CANADA: SUPPORTING HABITAT STEWARDSHIP PROJECTS FOR MONARCHS AND OTHER SPECIES AT RISK IN ONTARIO AND ACROSS CANADA

September 6 - Protecting and restoring nature is vital in the fight against biodiversity loss and climate change. The Government of Canada is committed to safeguarding species at risk and the habitats they depend on to ensure a resilient and thriving environment, and healthy, prosperous communities for current and future generations. Today, Adam van Koeverden, Parliamentary Secretary to the Minister of Environment and Climate Change, on behalf of the Honourable Steven Guilbeault, Minister of Environment and Climate Change, announced up to \$6.2 million in funding through the Habitat Stewardship Program for Species at Risk. This funding will support 38 conservation projects across Canada, led by communities, individuals, and non-government organizations, to help recover species at risk in their local areas. CHINA: USE OF ROGUE OIL TANKERS POSES SAFETY RISKS

September 4 - The Ceres I, an oil tanker part of a fleet evading international regulations, collided with another vessel in July 2024, raising safety concerns. Analysts believe the Ceres I was spoofing its location to mask illicit oil transfers, making it undetectable to other ships. China's demand for discounted oil from sanctioned countries fuels the growth of these dangerous fleets.

DENMARK: ONE IN FIVE RUSSIAN TANKERS REFUSE PILOTS IN DANISH STRAITS

September 10 - Since partial sanctions on Russian oil shipping began to take hold in 2022, Danish maritime authorities have been concerned about the risks posed by fly-by-night "dark fleet" tankers carrying crude to market from Russia's Baltic terminals. The Danish Straits have narrow channels for merchant ships, and the risk of a collision or grounding - for which dark fleet ships might not have insurance - is a real possibility. According to local investigative reporting outlet Danwatch, that risk is getting higher because more and more of these tankers are refusing to take aboard a qualified pilot for the passage. 13 New Marine Debris Projects Recommended For Funding Under Bipartisan Infrastructure Law

On September 5, the NOAA Marine Debris Program <u>announced the 13 projects recommended for its NOAA Marine Debris Removal and Interception Technologies grant awards</u> for Fiscal Year 2024, totaling over \$23 million in federal funding for marine debris removal. Funding for these opportunities was provided through the <u>Bipartisan Infrastructure Law</u>.

USA: WASHINGTON - BI SUPERFUND SITE GETS FUNDS TO SPUR CLEANUP

September 9 - The Wyckoff-Eagle Harbor Superfund Site on Bainbridge Island was awarded \$80 million from the Bipartisan Infrastructure Law, a massive nationwide grant program in its third year that provides localities and states with funding to update transportation facilities. About 650,000 gallons of toxic chemicals leftover from the use of creosote remain in the soil at Wyckoff after 40 years of Environmental Protection Agency-led cleanup efforts.
