MEDITERRANEAN COUNTRIES ENHANCE OIL SPILL **REPORTING AND MONITORING**



Mediterranean countries are taking joint action to protect the region's marine environment by improving the way they report, monitor and share data about shipping pollution incidents.

A workshop delivered through IMO's Integrated Technical Cooperation Programme (ITCP) in Lija, Malta (25-26 September) and organized by the Regional Marine Pollution Emergency Response Centre for the Mediterranean Sea (REMPEC), brought together 19 officials from Bosnia and Herzegovina, Egypt, Libya, Montenegro, Morocco, Tunisia and Türkiye. SAUDI ARABIA: GENERAL MEETING OF THE INTERNATIONAL CORAL REEF INITIATIVE
